## REFLECTION ON THIS SUNDAY'S GOSPEL

We do not instinctively associate the concept of love with the demand to be faithful to a series of rules. People often speak about love as if it is in opposition to rules and regulations: 'All you need is love' and 'Love and do what you will' are the type of sayings that are used in discussions as evidence that we do not need to worry about rules. Yet in the farewell speech to his disciples, Jesus was uncompromising when he explained the necessary connection between loving him and keeping his commandments. 'If you love me you will keep my commandments' In that speech, Jesus dealt with several other concerns. But he then returned to the link between love and the commandments. 'Anyone who receives my commandments and keeps them will be one who loves me; and anybody who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I shall love him and show myself to him.' The fundamental message of Jesus' moral teaching is that we are obligated to love God and our neighbour. We cannot love one without the other. It is impossible to compartmentalise God and people such that they remain unconnected. Our dealings with others have implications for our friendship with God. This is how, in practice, we connect love and rules. If we love God, we will keep his commandments. If we love our neighbour, we will not treat him or her unjustly. The teaching of Jesus offers us clear instructions to enable us to be faithful to God's will. It summarises what is required in order to live a wholesome life that reflects God's truth and beauty. Its purpose is to rid our lives of selfishness and self-centredness so that we can learn to put God and other people first and ourselves last.
